

What can I expect if I visit?

First you will be shown into the minister's office. After some initial introductions, these are the questions that I'll probably ask.

Context: What is going on in your life? What is concerning you most?

There is no doubt that God loves to be involved in what matters most in our lives. So, try to recall what is happening in your life, because there is a high possibility your dream is connected to this situation.

Pray: The Spirit of God is the only one who gives meaning and interpretation to our dreams. I will ask for God's Spirit to assist us in giving understanding as to your dream's meaning.

Describe the dream: I'll ask you to describe the dream and either record your voice or ask you to write it out. How you describe your dream is important, because you will naturally mention the most important parts. I'll be listening for key emotions, dominant actions and key symbols which feature strongly.

Overall theme: Often, prior to specific details coming clear, the overall theme of the dream will be apparent. If the interpretation is not clear by the end of the first session, I will seek God's guidance and contact you shortly after.
